He then attended the Pasadena Art Center and proceeded to graduate from the prestigious San Francisco Art Institute. His work is collected and shown internationally.

For over 20 years Matthew has exhibited his work while running an award winning food photography studio with his wife, a Chef and Author.

Together they also own and operate a successful art gallery - Super Fresh Food Art Gallery - The world's first Contemporary art gallery dedicated to art about food.
