Red Dot Art Fair makes its return to New York City at a newly renovated venue.

From March 3 to 6, the *Red Dot Art Fair* returns to New York City. This year, the event will take place at a new venue in the heart of SoHo. The event space, which is newly renovated, is located at 82 Mercer Street.

For the event, *Red Dot* is teaming up with the *Korean Art Show* to present 20 *Korean Art Show* galleries alongside *Red Dot* exhibitors. The partnership will give attendees the opportunity to visit both renowned fairs in one venue. The *Korean Art Show* is a project organized by the Galleries Association of Korea.

The opening reception for the fair will take place on Thursday, March 3, and will benefit the West Harlem Art Fund, a non-profit organization run by Savona Bailey-

McClain dedicated to promoting public art throughout New York City. All donations collected during the reception will support a unique art installation by artist Patrick Singh. The digital installation will be projected on the Manhattan Bridge during *Bridging Stone Figures* on Saturday, March 5, at 6 p.m., courtesy of the West Harlem Art Fund/Manhattan Bridge at the Pearl Street Triangle.

Red Dot Art Fair, under the direction of owner George Billis, will present approximately 50 international modern and contemporary art galleries. The galleries will feature a variety of works

including paintings, photography, sculpture and works on paper.
