When he's not sculpting, he's travelling to Colorado to spend time with his grand-kids. The last time he was there he built them a tree house with a slide.

Or he might be harvesting fruit from his farm in the Valley.

Or he might be exploring rough mountain roads with his wife.

Or travelling the world. Last summer he went to Vietnam. "I haven't been there since 1971," he said. "It was completely different."

Trujillo was a helicopter pilot in the Vietnam War, and is now working on a book of short stories about his experience. One of his short stories, "Dreaming in the Desert", was published and got second place in 2019 *Pasa Tiempo* short story contest.
